

The Lordsburg Schools will enroll any person within the school district who is qualified under New Mexico Statutes to attend public schools. Non-resident students may be enrolled in the Lordsburg schools with the approval of the superintendent.

The attendance policies of the Lordsburg School District will be based on New Mexico Statutes Annotated 22.12-1 through 22.12-7. Subject to approval by the Board of Education, individual schools within the district may adopt additional attendance policies.

Students enrolled in secondary schools of the district shall pursue high school graduation until attaining the age of majority. A student may be excused from this requirement if criteria as established and published in Section 22-12-2 of the Compulsory Act have been fulfilled.

Students who are 18 years of age or more may continue to pursue high school graduation or may choose to enroll in selected courses as special students.

Students 18 years of age or older who are enrolled for high school graduation purposes are subject to the same academic and disciplinary regulations as other students. If the person is of eligible age, the high school principal shall counsel with them in terms of pursuing a GED equivalency diploma.

Special students who are 18 years old or older and who are high school graduates or who do not wish to pursue high school graduation may enroll in selected classes for personal betterment or other valid reasons. Such enrollment will be allowed only on a space-availability basis.

Any student dropping out of school after executing the necessary forms may not re-enroll in school until the beginning of the next semester.
