

There shall be no general purpose fees charged any student in the school system. Students may, however, be required to provide materials to be used in "take home" fabrication projects. In the event that the student cannot afford the cost of materials, the school district must provide alternatives.

Instructors' requests for students to bring standard traditional school supplies to school for personal use is permitted. Principals of buildings will keep lists of approved items. Instructors should not deviate from this list without consulting the principal.

Some classes offered by the school may require considerable personal expense on the part of the student. The school will keep expenditures minimal. Every effort will be made by the school district to assist students who are in financial distress as a result of class requirements. However, budget limitations will not permit the school to fully subsidize all programs offered.

School officials may sell materials to students, provided the students clearly understand that they may obtain the materials elsewhere and that no coercion is applied to foster the sale of materials offered by the school. In this type of transaction there shall be no profit made which is not credited to a school activity or school function. Principals shall monitor carefully collections of money by instructors in payment for materials required by them of students in their charge.
